ONE YEAR ANNIVERSARY

The Tides of Change Economic Development Strategy, the result of months of work and ideas from more than 200 Cormorant Island residents, launched one year ago this month.

Village Mayor, Michael Berry, says that "This island is unique, culturally, socially and economically. We don't want to take any of that for granted. So an important part of the plan is to strengthen what we have for ourselves, and then find ways to share it."

A national program called CEDI, that encourages collaboration between First Nations and municipalities, identifies only two joint economic development plans in Canada, one of the two being Cormorant Island's Tides of Change. But Tides of Change is unique in that it's rooted in decades-old relationships between individuals and governments from the island's neighbouring communities.

"We have a long history of working together on this island," says 'Namgis Councillor Kelly Speck. "Residents built on that with tremendous participation, excellent ideas, and strong commitment to making Tides of Change work. This is everyone's future."

May 2016 Enforcement Initiatives

In support of the identified priority of road safety, the Alert Bay RCMP will be participating in provincial and national traffic enforcement campaigns throughout the year. In the month of May you can expect to see your RCMP members engaging in activities in support of Canada Road Safety Week May 17-23 as well as National and Provincial Impaired Driving enforcement campaigns over the May long weekend. These coordinated efforts will occur in addition to the regular education and enforcement efforts made throughout the year.

The Alert Bay RCMP has observed the troubling trend of children not being properly secured in moving vehicles. According to ICBC, each year an average of 1,400 children aged nine and under are injured and five are killed in motor vehicle crashes. Every time a child travels as a passenger in a motor vehicle, they are at risk of being involved in a collision (even with the reduced traffic speeds in Alert Bay). Drivers are reminded that it is your responsibility to make sure that all your passengers are properly secured with seatbelts or child-restraint systems. Child car seats are required until at least nine years old or 145 cm (4'9"), whichever comes first. The RCMP is currently in the early stages of planning an education process to inform community members about this safety concern and its legal requirements.

As noted in past updates, there has been significant improvement noted in driving practices, particularly in the areas of distracted driving and the adherence to the direction of traffic signs. We look forward to this trend continuing as we work together to make our community the safest it can be for all of us. If anyone notes any dangerous driving practices on our roads, please continue to advise police so that we can focus our efforts in those problem areas or ensure the identified drivers are made aware of the potential consequences of their actions.

We look forward to even more interaction within the community as we move into the summer season. Please feel free to speak with any member of your RCMP detachment in regards to any questions you may have or to share any concerns we can work with you to resolve.
