On March 6, a juvenile Bald Headed Eagle was spotted perching low on a tree in Alert Bay on Fir Street near the Government Dock. It had a large growth under its left eye, as seen above. O.W.L. Orphaned Wildlife Rehabilitation Society responded to requests for help, concerned that it could be Avian Pox, which is contagious and fatal if untreated.

The bird was seen two days later on Fir Street. It was weak enough that animal control officer David Faren captured it by throwing a blanket over it. It died shortly thereafter, and its body was triple-bagged for transport to the BC Animal Health Centre to determine cause of death. Thank you to Robin Quirk, David Faren and Mayor Berry for their concern and expertise.

NO ROOM FOR BROOM!

Help us combat invasive plants!

Scotch broom is native to Mediterranean regions of Europe. It was brought to other continents as a garden ornamental and is now an invasive species in India, New Zealand, Australia, and the Pacific Coast of North America. It displaces native plants, affecting the forestry industry by out-competing native tree seedlings.

Each plant produces thousands of seeds that sprout in open or disturbed soil. Plants are extremely flammable, dead or alive, and cut plants leach toxins.

Cutting broom must be done carefully to minimize regrowth and seed scattering. If stem is narrower than a pencil, pull it. If wider than a pencil, cut the stem below the surface, after flowering but before seed pods form.

Do you have Scotch broom? Take it to the transfer station, or call Public Works at 974-7091 for free curbside broom pick-up while it blooms in April & May.

patience in waiting for a new banking service and for your enthusiastic input in planning a brighter economic future for our island!

The first three months of your new Council's term have gone by very quickly, starting with our 'boot camp' in January. This year, instead of only new Councillors going away to learn about the workings of local government, we brought in a Parliamentarian to lead a 2-day session for Council and Senior Management staff. This was a great opportunity for all of us to learn how to work together in a formal setting and to be reminded of the procedures dictated by the Community Charter.

The 'Namgis/Village of Alert Bay Steering Committees have been working hard on the joint Economic Development Strategy and Vancity Memorandum of Understanding. The doors of the Vancity Cormorant Island Branch will be opening this spring and the 'Tides of Change' joint Economic Development Strategy is ready for the action phase. Recent joint council meetings with 'Namgis Council have strengthened our working relationship, and the Historic Alert Bay Accord is alive and well, proving once again that we can accomplish greater things together.



In March Village Council and Senior Staff developed the 2015 budget and 5-year Financial Plan. It is always a challenge to ensure that essential services are provided and that funds are available to upgrade aging infrastructure (roads, sewers, water, etc.), while keeping our Village affordable for residents. Thankfully, we obtained grants for structural repairs and a much-needed face lift to the Community Hall (almost complete!) and we hope a recently submitted grant application will help us upgrade the sewer.

Spring is upon us after a surprisingly gentle winter and I am looking forward to getting back out on the water to enjoy the totally awesome area we live in and maybe a fresh fish or two. I truly hope that you are all well and hope to see you at an occasional Monday Council meeting.

WALK TO RUN CLINIC

Want to start running? The Village is offering a running clinic for 13 weeks in May to July, leading to the Salmon Run 5K!

Cost: \$20 for all sessions. Register at the Village Office. Fitness level required: Ability to walk for 30 minutes. Age level: Anyone with the patience to follow the group! Time & date: Tuesdays 5-6pm and Saturdays 10-10:30am. Meet in the Village Office lobby. First session is May 5. Time commitment: You may find it difficult to keep up if



you miss more than a week. We recommend you try to fit in a third walk/run session every week on your own.

Tuesday sessions will start with 20-30 minutes of discussion. Potential topics include: goal-setting, warming up, fueling for a run, racing etiquette, staying injury-free, and how to motivate yourself. Saturday sessions will just be walking/running!

Adriana Pritchard will be leading most sessions. Adriana is a running enthusiast who won the women's Salmon Run 10K in 2014, achieved her goal time at her first half marathon in March, and plans to run her first marathon in May. SPACE ETIQUETTE FOR DOGS

To: People with "Friendly Dogs", Off-Leash Dogs, & Retractable Leash Dogs



NEWSFLASH: Running up to another dog and ignoring requests to go away is not "friendly", it is rude.

Just like people, DOGS NEED PERSONAL SPACE. If a stranger came up and put his hand on your body, you'd be allowed to step back, yell, and push him away. Dogs have the same right to enforce their boundaries. Some dogs are called "reactive" because they are more sensitive than others. Reactive dogs are good dogs, they just need more distance and compassionate training. You can help them by honoring their need for personal space.

- 1. NEVER LET YOUR OFF-LEASH DOG GO UP TO AN ON-LEASH DOG.
- 2. LOCK RETRACTABLE LEASHES WHEN YOU SEE OTHER DOGS.

3. ASK BEFORE APPROACHING OR PETTING ANY DOG.
