COUNCIL UPDATE

- Campground washroom upgrade was awarded to Abernethy Contracting.
- Council loaned \$2500 to the Alert Bay Museum. The money will be used to return a canoe that was restored by Will Malloff to the museum collection.
- Council gave Seafest a \$500 donation, use of the Community Hall, free bowling during Musicfest, the road closure, \$200 of copying, \$1500 for electrical cable, and machine and staff time to install electricity to Jubilee Park. Thanks to volunteer Councillor Kane Gordon for his electrical upgrade work.
- Council gave Artfest a \$200 donation and the use of the Netloft for Artfest.
- Council provided a letter of support to the Legion for their grant application to repair the building, especially the roof.
- Council accepted the 2014 Annual Report, available at www.alertbay.ca and in the Village Office.
- The Village of Alert Bay and the 'Namgis First Nation selected Ecoplan
 International to prepare the Cormorant Island Economic Development

 Strategy. Keep your eyes peeled for more information on how you can help!
- Alert Bay Artists Society donated the mural "Pod Pieces". Council may display it on the ferry line-up sign. Thank you artists!
- Local innkeepers supported the 2% Hotel Tax for the next 5 years. 20% goes to assist with local tourism advertising and 80% to a regional tourism fund.
- Banking situation— The closure of the Coastal Community Credit Union has left a gap in our community, but the 'Namgis First Nation has been working hard in soliciting other financial institutions to come to the island. Thank you to the 'Namgis for including us and for leading this process. In appreciation, Council has approved a donation towards project costs.
- Ist reading of the Official Community Plan occurred in July, with a Public Hearing scheduled Wednesday August 6th at 7pm in the Council Chambers. The OCP can be found at www.alertbay.ca and at the Village Office.

OFFICIAL COMMUNITY PLAN PUBLIC HEARING

Wednesday August 6th, 2014 at 7:00pm in the Council Chambers

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN Pursuant to sections 890 and 892 of the Local Government Act that a Public Hearing will be held for the purpose of hearing representations concerning: Official Community Plan Bylaw No. 759, 2014.

PURPOSE OF BYLAW: The purpose is to adopt a new Official Community Plan for all lands within the boundaries of the Corporation of the Village of Alert Bay (the 'Village') and repeal Bylaw No. 589. The Official Community Plan is a statement of objectives and policies to guide decisions on planning and land use management within the Village.

AT THE HEARING the public will be allowed to make representations to Council or present written submissions respecting matters contained in the proposed bylaw and will be afforded reasonable opportunity to be heard.

FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that a copy of the 'Official Community Plan Bylaw No. 759, 2014' may be inspected on the Village's website or at the Village office Monday to Friday 9:00am to 5:00pm (excluding stat holidays).

WRITTEN SUBMISSIONS will be accepted up to 5:00pm on August 6th, 2014.

2014 ELECTIONS

Municipal election days are Wednesday, November 5th and Saturday, November 15th. Mayor and Council, School District Trustees and Regional District Directors will be elected for four-year terms.

WHO CAN VOTE? YOU MUST:

Be 18 years or older
Be a Canadian citizen (landed immigrants not eligible)
Have lived in B.C. for six months
Have lived in Alert Bay for 30 days
Not be disqualified by law

WHAT DO I NEED TO BRING?

You CANNOT vote without: Two pieces of ID with place of residence, one with signature, OR Two pieces of ID, one with signature, and a solemn declaration of place of residence.

WANT TO RUN FOR COUNCIL?

If you are interested in running for Council, consider attending a Council meeting on August 27th, September 10 & 24, October 8 & 22 or November 12. There are also information packages available at the Village Office.

COUNCIL RESPONSIBILITIES

Alert Bay has a Mayor and four Councillors, whose responsibilities are set out in the Community Charter. Council must:

Consider the Village's best interests. Represent the will of the public.

Determine services and levels of service delivery.

Council may only exercise its authority collectively, by resolution or bylaw, at a Council meeting. Each Council member has one vote and must vote on any question. If a Councillor does not vote, she or he is deemed to have voted in the affirmative.

The Mayor is the Chief Executive Officer of the Village. In addition to Council responsibilities, the Mayor:

Presides at Council meetings and provides leadership to Council

Provides general direction about Village policies staff through the Chief Administrative Officer (CAO)
