# A CHAT WITH A COUNCILLOR

COUNCILLOR KANE GORDON UPDATES US ON COUNCIL GOINGS-ON This is my second term on Council and it's nice to see some of the projects we started last term get finished. I'm also happy to see the work done so far on our dock. As a Small Craft Harbour, the federal department of fisheries is responsible for the upgrades. So far the upper portion of the dock has been replanked and the railings are new. In September 2015, the work will continue with the floats being rebuilt. Some of the old materials will be reused elsewhere on the island.

I've also been pleased to see the Alert Bay Summer Market start up this summer. There have been two markets so far with great turnouts. It's been nice to see local musicians out playing in the square. The next market—and last market this summer—is August 16, and I encourage any musicians to come join us in the town square noon-4pm.

I was born and raised in Alert Bay, and other than a 2-year electrical apprenticeship in Vancouver and Victoria, I've lived here my whole life. I was a fisherman until about 25 years ago when I decided to go into the trades. When I get some free time, I enjoy getting out on the water sports fishing. What I love about Alert Bay is the kindness of the people here.

# **VILLAGE OFFICE UPDATES**

#### **SEWER FUNDING!**

Residents of Alert Bay will benefit from new water and wastewater infrastructure thanks to joint funding from the Small Communities Fund.

In Alert Bay, the project will replace a kilometre of sewer pipes with modern sewer mains, tie-ins and connections. It will reduce the Village's sewer system operating and maintenance costs, which were rising due to more pipe collapses, and it will also reduce the handling of excess wastewater volumes from infiltration into the failing system.

The federal government, provincial government and Village of Alert Bay will share the costs of the \$789,693 project. Mayor Michael Berry said, "We look forward to submitting new applications for upgrades to a similarly antiquated drinking water distribution system as new funding opportunities become available in the future."
