GENERAL INFORMATION

PROPANE TANKS AND RECYCLING

From Multi Materials BC (MMBC): Summer is an interesting time in the recycling world. Collectors and processors see an increase in problematic seasonal materials that, in addition to contaminating recyclable materials, can pose serious problems including worker injury, explosions and fires.

Compressed gas cylinders are dangerous when included with packaging and printed paper recycled at the curb, in multi-family buildings or at depots. One of the greatest risks when it comes to compressed gas is the risk of explosion. Cylinders, if ruptured, can become self-propelled rockets or pinwheels, or they may explode and catch fire either on recycling trucks, or during processing.

Please, help us keep everyone safe. Do not include compressed gas cylinders with your household's curbside, multi-family or MMBC depot recycling.
