VANCITY FAQS



Vancity is working with the community to put together a detailed service proposal. We will know for sure if it is going ahead and have more details about services by the end of the month.

How do I move an account to Vancity? What will it cost?

There will be someone in Alert Bay to sign you up.
Opening a personal account should take less than an hour. Opening a business account requires preopening paperwork, then less than an hour in-person.

How do I transfer a loan, mortgage, GIC, etc? Will there be penalties?

More complex transactions, including mortgages, lending, and RRSPs, would be done either over the phone

or in person. Your application must be approved through Vancity's application process. For loans, Vancity would pay the other institution out directly to transfer the loan, and for mortgages we would need to go through legal teams. Normally there are no penalties for paying loans, but check with your financial institution to be sure.

Are VC's loan/mortgage/savings interest rates comparable to CCCU or CIBC? We regularly check our interest rates against other institutions'.

Will there be a full-service ATM?

We understand the importance of being able to withdraw cash and make deposits, but a full-service ATM may be unsustainable. We are exploring options for essential needs, including various ATM options.

How many days/week would it be open and where?

We are planning in-person service in a central location at least one day per week for basic

transactions. More complex transactions would be done over the phone or in person as needed. We're focusing on needed services rather than an unsustainable full-service physical branch.

When will we know more?

We have a deadline of the end of December 2014 to have a decision and/or business framework in place.

WEATHER CAMERAS

NavCanada has installed two cameras at the airstrip. The cameras are pointed in different directions showing the current airport weather & visibility conditions. There are over 100 cameras installed across Canada at uncontrolled airports. This allows pilots to make a decision whether to land or not when planning a trip. The cameras are up and running but not yet accessible via the NavCanada website. They should be visible in the near future.
