CREDIT UNION CLOSURE

The 'Namgis First Nation, Village of Alert Bay and Whe-la-la-u Area Council have engaged the services of Headwater Capital Consulting to conduct a Cormorant Island Financial Services Survey of the financial needs of Alert Bay residents and businesses. This survey is being conducted in response to the closure of the Coastal Community Credit Union (CCCU) at Alert Bay, on July 5, 2014.

After more than 60 years of having banking services on Cormorant Island, beginning with the Alert Bay and District Credit Union, this will bring significant hardship to our residents, businesses and organizations. There is no doubt that our banking practices will change in the future, especially given the increasing use of electronic banking tools, but a complete transition away from having physical banking services available to our communities will take some time.

We would like to attract an alternative financial institution to establish a branch at Alert Bay. Any financial institution that may be interested in establishing a branch at Alert Bay will require information about the financial needs of residents and businesses at Alert Bay. This is the information that we are seeking through the survey. We strongly encourage you to participate in the Cormorant Island Financial Services Survey. All information that you provide to Headwater Consulting will kept confidential, anonymous and not shared with anyone. The results will be reported in aggregate form only.

Joseph Isaac of IVM Business, Kim Peterson of the 'Namgis First Nation and Heather Nelson-Smith of the Village of Alert Bay will assist Headwater Consulting in conducting the survey. Peter van Gils of Headwater Consulting and Joseph Isaac will assist local businesses. Kim Peterson and Heather Nelson-Smith will be available to local residents to complete the surveys and collect completed surveys on behalf of Headwater Consulting.

While we continue to work on attracting alternative financial institutions to Alert Bay, we ask that if possible, that you hold off on moving your accounts from CCCU to another financial institution until early July. The potential to create a unified shift in the island's capital may be the tipping point that improves our options when it comes to the various financial services that we need.

Thank you in advance for your participation in taking the survey, which should take no more than 15 to 20 minutes to complete. This small act will go a long way towards helping us attract an alternative financial institution to our community.

Your data will be anonymous but we will record your name to ensure that each person only completes the survey once. If you have difficulty completing the survey, the Alert Bay Village Office can offer assistance.


ALERT BAY ARTLOFT LOONIE AUCTION

LITTER-FREE ALERT BAY!

MYTH: Litter control is not important

MYTH: No one notices litter

FACT: Litter destroys the beauty of a community. People come from all over the world to see our community. When litter mars their enjoyment, we lose valuable tourist dollars.

MYTH: Litter doesn't hurt anyone

FACT: Litter is a safety hazard. Litter is a breeding ground for fire and disease. FACT: Litter impacts car insurance rates because thousands of auto accidents are litter-related.

FACT: Ingesting, getting tangled in, or getting cut by litter can kill marine life, pets, birds and other wild animals inhabiting our island.

FACT: Litter is a breeding ground for rats, disease-causing bacteria and more litter.

MYTH: Litter doesn't affect the economy

FACT: Litter discourages economic development by impacting tourism and real estate values. It is harder to sell a home in a litter-strewn neighbourhood. Many businesses will not choose to operate in a community that cannot effectively control litter.
