OPEN FIRE RESTRICTION

EFFECTIVE NOON WEDNESDAY MAY 27, 2015 CATEGORY 2 OPEN FIRES WILL BE PROHIBITED IN THE COASTAL FIRE CEN-TRE JURISDICTION (INCLUDING CORMORANT ISLAND) TO HELP PREVENT HUMAN CAUSED WILDFIRES AND PROTECT PUB-LIC SAFETY.

THIS PROHIBITION WILL REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL OCTOBER 16, 2015 OR THE PUBLIC IS OTHERWISE NOTIFIED.

PLEASE NOTE THAT YOU MAY STILL HAVE CAMPFIRES AS THIS DOES NOT PROHIBIT CAMPFIRES THAT ARE A HALF-METRE HIGH BY A HALF-METRE WIDE OR SMALLER, OR APPLY TO COOKING STOVES THAT USE GAS, PROPANE OR BRIQUETTES.


NEPAL EATHQUAKE DISASTER RELIEF



The evening will be an interactive look at challenges facing the community and achievable solutions.


There will be a short film on climate change, a speech by Mr. Suzuki, and the opportunity to give your input!

Boulevards

Boulevards are the responsibility of the property owner/ occupier to maintain throughout the village of Alert Bay. The Boulevard is the section of land between the property line and the edge of the pavement or curb of the road. Where there is no pavement or curb, the boulevard is the areas between the property line and the traveled portion of the road.

Please take this time to familiarize yourself with your responsibilities in relation to your property and the boulevard under Village of Alert Bay Bylaw No. 241.

FACTS ABOUT LITTERING

- 1. 9 billion tons of litter ends up in the ocean every year.
- 2. 50% of littered items are cigarette butts.
- 3. 50% of smokers do not use a receptacle or trash can.
- 4. 75% of people admitted that they littered in the past 5 years.
- 5. The most common item found during litter clean up in Alert Bay if food wrappers.
- 6. Litter invites more litter. Once litter has accumulated along a road or in a community, people are more likely to keep littering

WHAT CAN I DO TO STOP LITTER?

- 1. First, don't litter. Set a good example for your friends, kids and neighbors. Even an apple core is considered litter.
- Never throw trash out of your car window. Also, be aware when driving with your windows open. Loose items like paper or candy wrappers can fly out easily.
- 3. At home, secure the lids on your trash and recycling containers, especially when you set them out on collection day.
- 4. When recycling at the curb, secure or bundle loose papers and other light objects tightly so they won't get carried away with the wind.
- 5. If you smoke, never throw your cigarette butts on the ground. Cigarette butts, while small, actually constitute a large part of existing litter.
- 6. Clean up after your dog. Yes, that's litter too!
- 7. If you see litter, pick it up. Even if it's one chip bag or straw wrapper that's one less piece of litter on the street.



Beach Log Salvage

Did you know that the Village has a policy regarding the salvage of wood from the beach? Regulations:

- 1. All regulations under the marine log salvage guidelines as set by the Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural resource operations must be followed.
- 2. All salvage wood must be secured seaward of the seawall.
- 3. The use of any village property to affix ropes for log salvage including but not limited to, Seawall, boulevards, trees, fences, pilings, boardwalks, sign posts, and picnic tables is strictly prohibited.
- 4. Residual sawdust, debris including left over equipment, gas cans, garbage, log debris in
 - cluding bark resulting from the collecting of wood must be kept to a minimum and not be permitted to accumulate or be left behind.
- 5. Motorized vehicles must not be operated on foreshore land or beach and vehicles must not block pedestrian access
- 6. The seawall must not be used to parbuckle or drag logs to the boulevard.
- 7. Firewood stored on the seawall or boulevard must be neatly stacked, and storage is limited to one month (30 days).
