As you can see, there are many projects that have moved ahead, including the Boardwalk re-lighting project; installation of new floats at the boat launch; the start of informative signage (Tides of Change Economic Development Strategy); completion of Library/Visitor Centre roofing; and airport runway crack repairs. Kudos to our Public Works Staff for moving these important initiatives forward.

There is also a lot of work going on behind the scenes. As most are likely aware, our much-valued Chief Administrator (CAO), Heather Nelson-Smith, has moved on to Port Hardy to take up a position there (all the best, Heather). We are awaiting a response to our joint application for funding to move the community-identified priority projects along. Apart from the 'quick-starts', such as information signage and reducing litter, we are focusing on harbor redevelopment with special focus on marine fuel supply and increased moorage to attract and retain visitors.

RCMP UPDATE FROM ALERT BAY DETACHMENT COMMANDER SERGEANT BRETT SINDEN

The Alert Bay RCMP continues to receive reports of ongoing unsafe driving practices. Significant efforts have been made to correct these behaviors through educational campaigns as well as written warnings and letters to offending drivers locally. In conjunction with the Christmas party season impaired driving initiatives, the Alert Bay RCMP will be increasing enforcement action in all areas of driving safety in our ongoing efforts to support safe roadways for our community members. Please be aware of the consequences of some commonly reported infractions. Failing to wear seat belts, using electronic devices while driving (3 demerit points), and failing to obey stop signs (3 demerit points) all carry a \$167.00 fine.



The Alert Bay RCMP encourages members of our community to continue to report dangerous activity as we work together in the area of road safety. Please contact the detachment at 250-974-5544. Should the call be after hours or when members are tied up on other matters please leave a message on non-urgent matters or select the option to speak with a dispatcher if it relates to something requiring more urgent attention.

As always, 911 remains the emergency contact for crimes in progress such as a drunk drivers, violent incidents or thefts in progress. We wish everyone all the best as we move into the holiday season and look forward to interacting with designated drivers at our ongoing checkstops.
