
Often the winning vessels in the Alert Bay 360 are surfskis.

Unusual items Bizarre shoreline finds include an Elvis costume, hair extensions, wedding dress, lava lamp, false teeth... and many more!

Shoreline litter is a clear risk

to our environment and can:

Travel great distances A plastic bag can blow into a storm drain and wind up in a local waterway or float down a stream into a nearby lake.

Persist in the environment for many years. A plastic bottle left on the shoreline may take up to 450 years to break down.

Impact water quality through contamination. Many litter items contain harmful toxins that leach into the environment as they break down.

Pose entanglement threats to wildlife Wildlife entangled in litter can sustain long-term injuries or even loss of life.

Be fatally ingested by wildlife Eating litter can lead to choking, poisoning and even malnutrition among wildlife.

Pose a safety risk to people Shoreline litter can be well hidden and cause injury to unsuspecting passerby.

Create economic damage Litter ruins the aesthetic value of the natural environment which can negatively influence income generated by local business and tourism.

During the last power outage,
Alert Bay consumed a large amount of water. Dur-



ing an outage, we must use generators to fill the reservoir. These generators also keep our sewer system running and have limited capacity. It is also important to conserve water during an outage so water is available for the Fire Dept.

DO NOT USE WATER FOR: Watering your lawn Pressure washing Laundry
